

Expeditions at Northwest Passage

At Northwest Passage, we believe every student deserves the chance to experience the world beyond the classroom. Our expeditions are extended learning journeys designed to spark curiosity, build teamwork, and open doors to new cultures, environments, and ways of life. Each expedition is an opportunity to step into the unknown, challenge yourself, and grow in different ways. To make sure every student has this experience, the school is committed to fully funding at least one expedition for each student before graduation.

Expeditions are built around the idea of learning through progress. They are offered at different levels, each one preparing you for the next. A Level 1 expedition introduces you to the adventure; after completing it, you can move on to Level 2, and then to the advanced opportunities of Level 3. If you're not ready to move up right away, you still have the chance to continue exploring at your current level until the time is right.

Every expedition is a chance to discover not only the world around you—but also your own strengths, passions, and potential.

Level I: 1-3 Nights, up to 2.5 hours from school, 0.25 credits

Examples: Leadership Camp, Service Learning Trip, Short Camping Trip

Level II: 2-4 Nights, up to 1-day drive from school, 0.375 credits

Examples: Midwest Backpacking, Midwestern City, Academic Competition

Level III: 4+ Nights, up to 2-day drive from school, 0.5 credits

Examples: Extended Wilderness, East Coast City, International Trip

Dates and times could change, or the expedition could be cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances. We will make every effort to hold to this schedule.

Backpack: Garden of the Gods

A day's drive brings us to the Garden of the Gods, the most photographed landscape in the state of Illinois. We'll hoist our packs for 3 days and 2 nights on trail, hiking past amazing rock formations and hidden caves. Millions of years ago, this area was covered by a giant inland sea where rivers deposited sand and mud. This sediment eventually hardened into



sandstone layers. A later uplift raised the land above sea level, and subsequent erosion by wind, rain, and freezing/thawing cycles sculpted the unique rock formations we see today. Northwest Passage can provide all the camping gear to outfit you for your needs in the forest.


